Additional Information

For more than 30 years, I have been researching global health issues to inform policy and programming. Much of my work has been focused on strengthening health systems, and in particular, improving access to and quality of sustainable health services.

Over the past 12 years, I have established global health practices from the ground up at two small businesses. To meet that end, I conceived and developed analytical frameworks such as a [Quality of Care Measurement Index](#) that was first tested in an impact evaluation of a results-based financing pilot. Another analytical framework I created [measures the key determinants of sustainability](#) and was applied in a multi-country, cross-sectoral study of the US government's Ebola recovery effort in West Africa.

Early in my career, I was a clinical nurse at Stanford University Hospital where I cared for patients suffering from AIDS before HIV was sero-typed and protocols were established.
