Dr. Bolanle Oyeledun is a female public health physician with over thirty five (35) years of increasing responsibilities and experience in policy development, program management, health systems and international development including 27 years in progressively senior leadership capacity in successful management and implementation of major integrated health and development programs including HIV and AIDS, other infectious diseases, reproductive health management, maternal, newborn and child health and implementations science research projects in low-resource settings. Demonstrated abilities include excellent understanding of health systems across several settings, mobilizing resources and managing highly successful comprehensive health programs ranging from reproductive health, immunization, child survival and comprehensive gender transformational HIV/AIDS care and treatment programs including pediatric care and prevention of mother to child transmission of HIV in sub-Saharan countries, advocacy, and ability to promote the use of research for the improvement of health systems in developing countries, particularly Sub-Saharan Africa, including the scale-up of successful interventions.

She has effectively and rapidly built a comprehensive HIV care and treatment program within 3 years from scratch to a leading and highly respected quality focused and result oriented institution. Progressively raised operational funds through performance-based growth from under USD 1million dollars annually to over 45million dollars annually in less than 3 years. Spearheaded and successfully transitioned international grant to indigenous management and ownership and got it funded with an initial grant from the US Government which ended in September 29, 2022 to the tune of approx. USD170 million. (This has now been renewed to end in 2027). Bola presently leads and manages a multi-grant portfolio comprising of comprehensive AIDS care and treatment, primary health care, immunization, health systems strengthening and implementation science interventions with assured funding till 2027. She was recently named one of the Grant 22 challenge winners for the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (2019).

She possesses strong diplomatic and communication skills and proven ability to develop and sustain a close and effective working relationship with clients and stakeholders, at the highest levels, including the ability to work with international development partners and national governments and other stakeholders. She demonstrates a track record of leadership in public health and in HIV/AIDS, with experience of working with governments across sub-Saharan Africa, specialized foundations (GAVI Alliance, The GFATM), U.N. agencies, particularly WHO and UNICEF, as well as international and local non-governmental organizations. She was the first female elected chairperson of the Technical Review Panel for the Global Fund (GFATM) and also chaired the Independent review Committee for Gavi, for children vaccines (both Geneva headquartered international organizations with UN status) at different times since 2008.

A recipient of many outstanding awards for excellence and exceptional leadership, she most recently in October 2022 successfully led the Center for Integrated Health Programs (CIHP) to win the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Nigeria Public Health Excellence Award for Innovative Approach to HIV Case Finding and Linkage to ART.
