Harley Feldbaum has served as Head of Strategy and Policy at the Global Fund since 2014. Feldbaum directs the partnership's priorities to improve global health and accelerate progress against HIV, tuberculosis and malaria. He works closely with the Board to develop and implement the Global Fund's Strategy, oversees the Global Fund's key performance indicators, and coordinates policy development and strategy implementation across all divisions and departments.

Prior to joining the Global Fund, Feldbaum served as Director for Global Health, Food Security and Development for the White House National Security Council. He was a 2010-2011 White House Fellow and a Senior Public Health Advisor at the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).

He also served as a professorial lecturer and Director of the Global Health and Foreign Policy Initiative at the Johns Hopkins University's Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies. Earlier in his career, Feldbaum consulted for the Nuffield Trust on health and security issues.

Feldbaum earned a degree in biology with honors in general scholarship from Wesleyan University, a master's of public health from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and holds a doctorate in public health policy from the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine.
