Ilana Lapidos-Salaiz is a medical doctor with over twenty years of experience providing clinical care to underserved populations and managing complex public health programs. In her current position as Health Development Officer at USAID Washington DC she serves as a member of the Clinical Branch in the Office of HIV and AIDS (OHA). She provides technical leadership and programmatic support to USAID funded HIV prevention, care and treatment programs.

Before taking on this role, Dr. Lapidos-Salaiz served as Senior Technical Advisor in OHA since 2011. She co-chaired the USG interagency technical working group that lead the strategic realignment of the PEPFAR supported HIV care portfolio, and helped establish criteria for programs to prioritize HIV care and support activities objectively.

Dr. Lapidos-Salaiz has extensive experience in the public and private sector in several countries across Africa and the Caribbean, including: Eswatini (Swaziland), Haiti, Tanzania, Mali, Nigeria, Democratic Republic of Congo, Burundi, and Ghana. She has held leadership positions as well as operational roles in project design and management; and has been recognized for strong technical direction and support to missions in the field.
